TAMA AREA

It's like entering another world.
one-hour away from Tokyo downtown area.



The Tama area, located in the western part of Tokyo, is an area offering rich natural scenery such as beautiful forests and clear streams during all four seasons, as well as traditional Japanese food and culture such as local sake and indigo dyeing. Tama is also conveniently located and can be easily accessed from the city center via train or car in 60 to 90 minutes. It is perfect for enjoying daytrips and other excursions.

Ome

The western part is a mountainous area. Activities such as hiking on Mt. Mitake and water recreation along the Tama River are popular.

Fussa

The sights along National Highway next to the Yokota Air Base (USAF) is 16 present an American-like cityscape.

Higashi Murayama

There are many nature-rich parks around the Sayama Hills area, located in the northeastern part of the Tama district.

JAPANESE SAKE EXPERIENCE

There are many sake breweries in the Tama area because the abundant groundwater flowing through the Chichibu Paleozoic strata is ideal for sake brewing.

Sake is produced with clear water, carefully selected sake rice, and skillful brewers. The Tama area is blessed with abundant groundwater flowing through the Chichibu Paleozoic strata, and breweries have been operating throughout the area for many years. Many breweries allow visitors to visit by appointment. These tours are a wonderful opportunity to learn about the Japanese sake brewing process and see historic buildings.

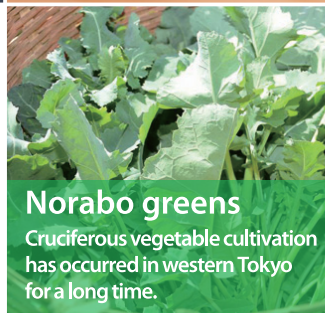

JAPANESE CULTURAL EXPERIENCE

Tama is a place where Japanese culture and traditions thrive. You can experience original Japan, such as festivals, lifestyles, and landscapes, which is long-lost in busy, modern city centers.

There is a variety of cultural experiences unique to Japan that can be enjoyed in the Tama area, such as dyeing clothes using traditional techniques to make dyes from local plants, the world-famous Japan Blue indigo dyeing technique, and traditional Japanese papermaking perfect for creating original arts and crafts. Ninja and tea ceremony experiences are also recommended at old private houses in the mountain village.

A variety of river activities such as rafting, canoeing, and SUPing can be enjoyed in the upper part of the Tama River, which runs through Tokyo from west to east. Other activities including riverside barbecuing and mountain stream fishing on the Akigawa River, a tributary of the Tama River.

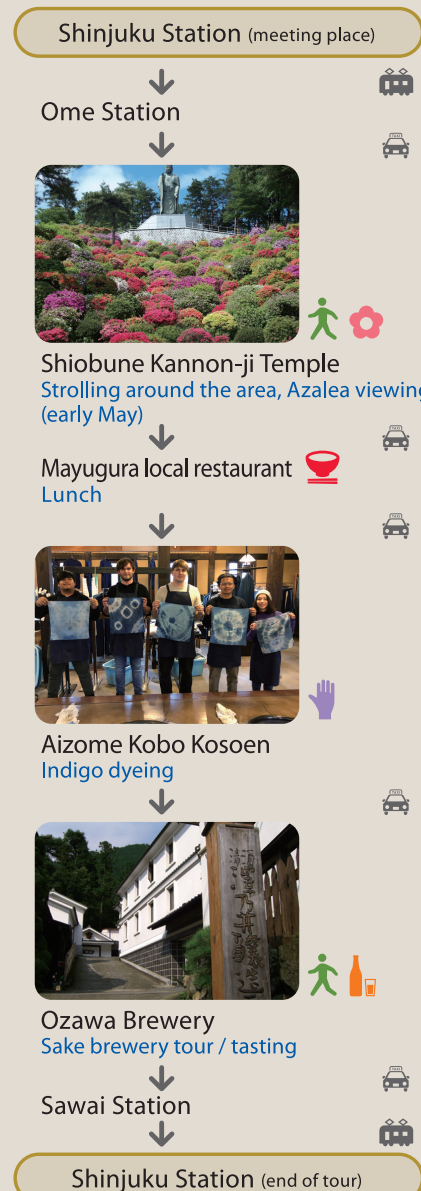

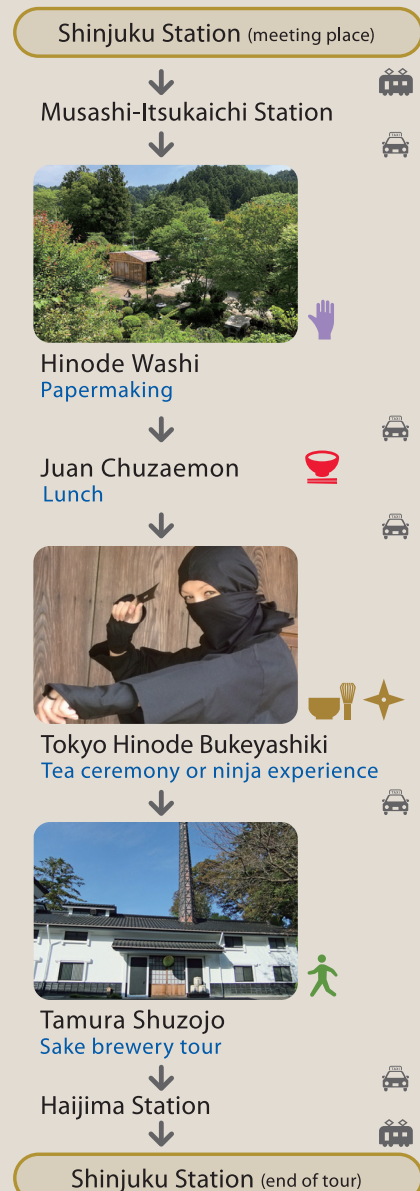

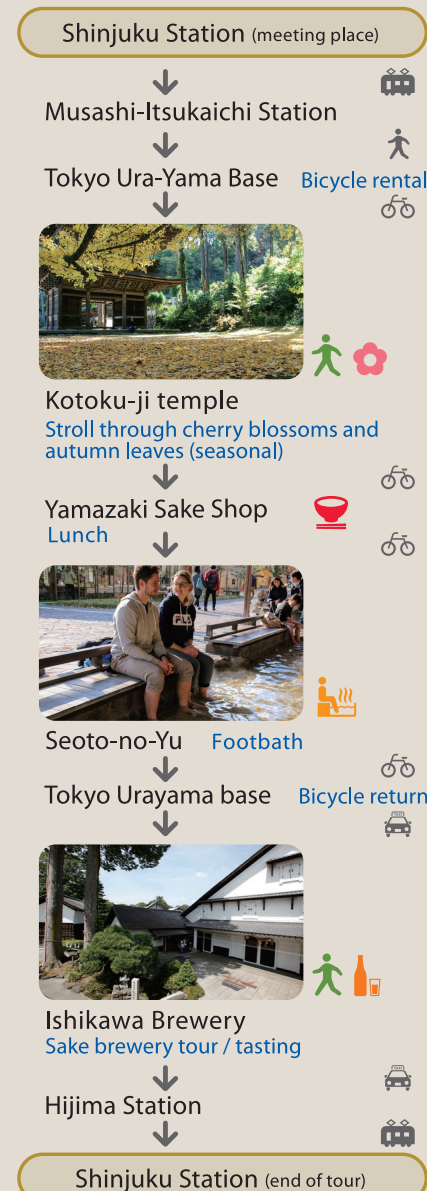

Q2. Has your impression of the Tama area changed after visiting it?

I found very interesting the location and the reasons why the breweries were located in the area. It's an easy to access location with interesting spots and I believe it would be good for people that may want to stay for a medium to long term in an area easy to reach to and from Tokyo itself.

Q3. What makes the Tama area attractive to foreigners?

The breweries visited during the tour were very interesting, especially Ishikawa Brewery is well prepared explanation and tasting. Regarding the area itself, the local restaurants and izakayas can provide a local and "authentic" experience that visitors would usually be looking for rather than going to the main tourist spots. Looking into actual attractions, maybe a route for the Thirteen Buddhas of Tama would be interesting for anyone that wants to go around the area with several spots to visit and stop by.

Q3. What kind of experience would you like to have in this area as a traveler?

I believe interactive experiences are among the best options to keep visitors interested and make them enjoy the tour and visits, from tasting the products, trying to work on the process or part of it, being able to ask questions and discuss with the people. For foreigners, most of the time this would mean that it's necessary for people to be able to communicate in English mainly, or having an interpreter (such as the one we had on the day).
